Sunday 28th June – Afternoon: Fitted dinghy racing before an opening party on Watling Island. Don't miss the "Misguided Tour" and history of Tower House and the Wizard of Oz!

Monday 29th June - The fleet sails west to Mangrove Bay and anchors in the turquoise waters of King's Point for lunch and a swim. In the afternoon there is a tour of the Royal Naval Dockyard and the National Museum of Bermuda (NMoB). In the evening, we dine in style across the bay at Sandy's Boat Club.



Tuesday 30th June – We leave Mangrove Bay, pass Somerset Long Bay, round Daniel's Head and HMS Vixen, transit Chubb Cut and the Western Channel at Bermuda's West End, pass Wreck Hill (where Bermudian wreckers would set lights to lure ships onto the reefs) and into the Atlantic along the South Shore.

Tuesday Lunchtime – the fleet turns into Castle Harbor and anchors near Frick’s Point for lunch and an incomparable swim in azure waters. Alternatively, those who wish can anchor off Cooper’s Island – an equally picturesque location.

Tuesday Evening – We move up Castle Harbour and anchor off Walsingham Bay. Dinner is at the c1652 Walsingham House, home for 200 years to Tom Moore's Tavern.

Wednesday 1st July – We transit the East End, around St. David’s Island to St George's for a tour of the Olde Towne. In the evening, Bermuda Yacht Services and Goslings will be our hosts for a cocktail party on Ordnance Island.

Thursday 2nd July - we head out through Town Cut, round Fort St. Catharine and anchor off Gibbett’s Island at the mouth of Flatts Inlet on the North Shore for a tour of the Bermuda Aquarium, Museum & Zoo (BAMZ) and a cruise around exquisite and rarely seen Harrington Sound on the Museum’s launch “Callista”.
