RNYC STORM DAMAGE

After St John's record paralyzing snowfall emergency lasting for weeks after Christmas, our friends in Long Pond took a another beating in January with the worst blizzard in 50 years which destroyed their seawall, docks, fuel dock, and bulkhead. https://www.cbc.ca/news/canada/newfoundland-labrador/yacht-club-damage-cbs-1.5436912.

The town has been working nonstop to dredge to a new 14' controlling depth and rebuild the seawall, but the club itself did not have insurance for their infrastructure and is seeking local, provincial, and Federal disaster relief assistance to restore this vital facility for visiting yachtsmen. CCA members voluntarily write cruising guides (a new version of the CCA Cruising Guide to Newfoundland with RNYC endorsement has just been published), run courses on safety and seamanship, contribute to the technical foundations of yacht design and systems, and take an active role in improving ocean health, collaborating with environmental organizations around the planet.

The Royal Newfoundland club will need significant help to recover from the storm damage, and the Cruising Club of America wishes to emphasize how important the RNYC is to the entire cruising community. The CCA is North America's leading organization supporting the activities of cruisers all over the world. The CCA has had a long and welcoming partnership with the RNYC and recommends that their recovery be given high priority for assistance from many sources.

With the harbour at St John's now dominated by commercial interests, the refuge and services provided by RNYC are indispensable to cruising boats. The CCA can attest that many members of our organization visit RNYC every summer and that the CCA influences many other cruisers to visit St. John's through the publication of its popular *CCA Cruising Guide to Newfoundland*. The CCA sells hundreds of issues of this 200-plus page book every year, and we are deeply grateful for the assistance received from many members of the Royal Newfoundland Yacht Club.

Boats will also typically exchange crew at RNYC with many individuals using hotel, airport, airline, and taxicab services throughout the summer months.

In summary, we believe that the Royal Newfoundland Yacht Club is a vital link to many members of the worldwide cruising boat community and we hope you will look favorably at providing desperately needed funds to support the restoration of their harbour of refuge and the many services they offer the significant number visitors to Newfoundland who arrive on privately owned boats.
