
Accomplished Sailors Making Adventurous Use of the Seas

- Club meetings and cruises to global destinations provide an opportunity for broader travel and exposure



Goal #1 – Continue to Build the CCA Community


- Focus on <u>community building</u>

- <u>100% volunteer operating model</u> focus on recruitment and development
 - Full schedule of CCA-sponsored events on and off the water
 - Create new communities within the CCA for example
 - · actively engaged in "adventurous use of the sea"
 - no longer active on the water, but who value CCA connections
 - Encourage and streamline volunteer participation
 - Focal point for support of volunteer recruitment, best practices, and recognition
 - Governing Board to review formation, expansion of committees to ensure alignment

Goal #2 – Maintain High Membership Standards and Return to Slow Membership Growth

- After period of stronger growth (2016-2020) <u>CCA membership has</u> declined (2020 – 2023)
- While <u>maintaining standards</u>, <u>return to slow growth of</u> 1-2% per year targeting ~ 1600 members in 2030
- Continue to expand percentage of members who are <u>Next Watch and or</u> <u>Women</u>
 - Focus on new member recruitment
 - · Messaging from Club and Station Leaders
 - Openness to creation of 2 new stations or posts by 2030
 - · Membership committee process review; station and club
 - Current Member Engagement
 - Value of membership
 - Personal communications
 - Governing Board
 - Membership dashboard twice per year detailed information
 - Review membership policies and dues to ensure alignment with objectives





Goal #3 – Increase Awareness of the CCA Among the Blue Water Community



- Members <u>Take Pride</u> in Accomplishments and Relevance of the CCA as a <u>Blue Water Leader</u>
- Recognition that we need to take an active role in <u>communicating</u> our messages and accomplishments
 - Intentional communications plan leveraging CCA publications, social media and communications to support messaging; branding standards
 - Highlighting CCA Leadership in Blue Water Activities
 - Outreach from CCA Stations to Local Yacht Clubs
 - West Coast Working Group How to leverage CCA involvement in West Coast Activites
 - "Messaging through our Members"
 - » Encourage members to acknowledge CCA membership when publishing / presenting

Mission Statement – Adopted at the Annual Meeting March 2023



The Cruising Club of America is a group of accomplished recreational offshore sailors bound together by friendship and the desire to foster the responsibilities, expertise, and skills needed for the adventurous use of the sea.

Members volunteer to achieve the CCA's goals by sharing experiences, organizing events on and off the water, promoting seamanship and best practices, and recognizing outstanding accomplishments by fellow members and the amateur sailing community. The Club's initiatives put particular emphasis on safety at sea education and training, exemplary offshore yacht design and construction, and environmental stewardship.

The CCA does not have a physical headquarters. The Club exists anywhere its members come together on land and sea. In popular sailing regions, members organize into stations which host local gatherings for members and guests.

The Club is known - since shortly after its founding in 1922 - for running the biennial Newport Bermuda Race and awarding the Blue Water Medal. More recently the CCA has added the Young Voyager Award, Roderick Stephens Seamanship Trophy, and Diana Russell Award for Innovation to honor those who represent the best of the Club's priorities. The Club has produced enduring books like *Nowhere Is Too Far, Far Horizons, Desirable and Undesirable Characteristics of Offshore Yachts, Safety for Cruising Couples,* and *Adventurous Use of the Sea*, cruising guides to the coast of Maine, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland, Gulf of Saint Lawrence, and Labrador, and the annual publication of members' articles, *Voyages*.
