MEMBERS OF THE SAF STATION NOT ABLE TO JOIN AS THEY ARE CRUISING.

Awardees who are not present to claim their awards.

- 1. **Jeanne Socrates**, recently inducted into the Cape Horner's Hall of Fame, is aboard her yacht *Nereida* in the Bay of Islands, New Zealand, following her single-handed voyage from Victoria, BC. Jeanne's goal is to sail to Far North Queensland (FNQ) to reunite with friends she made while she was marooned there for two years during the pandemic. <u>She is receiving a John Parkinson Memorial Trophy Award</u>.
- 2. **Ronnie Simpson** has rounded the Cape of Good Hope in his Ocean 50 yacht, *Shipyard Brewing* in the first-ever *Global Solo Challenge Race*. Ronnie started on October 29th from A Coruña, Spain, already back at 10th place, but has moved up to 3rd place and, with 17,548 nautical miles to go, he is projected to finish at A Coruña on March 6th. <u>He is receiving a John Parkinson Memorial Trophy Award</u>.
- 3. **Todd Hedin & Liz Baylis,** according to Facebook, are down under in New South Wales. Todd is receiving a <u>Transoceanic Pennant</u> for skippering their Antrim 27, *ET*, in the 2008 Pacific Cup to Hawaii. (Long overdue.)
- 4. **Anders Swahn**, builder/owner of the 122-foot, three-masted schooner *Wolfhound* is in Germany where *Wolfhound* is currently moored in Wilhelmshaven. (Her homeport is Charlotte Amalie, USVI, where she called in during 2022, winning Anders two Parkinson Memorial Trophy Awards as he crossed the Atlantic Ocean twice on *Wolfhound's* round-trip from Germany to the Virgin Islands.)
- 5. **Randall Reeves**, our SAF 2021 Blue-Water winner, well-remembered for his solo, *Figure 8* circumnavigation of the Americas and Antarctica in 2020, is off again on *Moli*. This time he has a crew member, Harmon Shragge, and the two of them hatched up an idea to do a "wrong way" multi-leg, multi-year circumnavigation <u>around the Americas</u>. That would be "clockwise" voyage that will have then sailing into the Roaring Forties when they round Cape Horn. *Moli* departed Sausalito on August 29th bound for Homer, Alaska, where the boat was put on the hard for the winter. Next summer, when the ice breaks up in the Northwest Passage, they hope to transit it and sail to Nova Scotia where the boat will be laid up again. Then, in Spring of 2025, Randall and Harmon plan to set sail for Cape Horn, round it and sail back to Sausalito.
- 6. **Nora Slayden** and her husband, Bruce, cruised over the top North America, in their 78-foot, high-latitude, expedition motor yacht, *Ugly Betty*. They departed St. Thomas, USVI on May 9, 2023, and have since visited Horta, Açores, Ireland, Scotland, and Greenland before transiting, east-to-west, the Northwest Passage to Alaska. After cruising to the Aleutian Islands, they set their course for British Columbia and the south to San Francisco Bay arriving in Sausalito on October 16th.
- 7. **Banu Oney**, with her husband Peter Saggers, is in Nelson, New Zealand aboard their yacht *Denize III*. Last year Banu and Peter sailed from New Zealand to Fiji and back but did not qualify for an award because they did not cross an ocean.

8. **Sylvia Seaberg**, who is actually at this dinner with her husband Tom Condy, but their yacht is in Fiji. They are regular cruisers in Fiji and, for the last two hurricane seasons, they have buried their yacht *Cinnabar*, in the sands of Viti Levu so they could return home for the holidays.
